

Ideas for Field Studies Singapore Tours

- **Outram Park** – Thai Buddhist temple – Wat Ananda Metyarama – 50 Jalan Bukit Merah, Sikh Gurudwara Temple, Bab =a House – NUS Peranakan Museum, Nei Xue Tang Museum, Duke-NUS medical centre, Blair Road conservation area, Kampong Bahru shophouses
- **Joo Chiat** – Telok Kurau Studios, Joo Chiat terrace houses on Koon Seng Road (Near the intersection of Joo Chiat Road and Koon Seng Road), Keuh makers, Malay Village
- **Chinese/Japanese Gardens** – could combine with suiseki – make small rock gardens
- **Green Roof** – Nanyang Technical Institute Art School – has galleries, classrooms with interesting studios
- **Lian Shan Shuang Monastery and Temple** – Tao Payoh
- **Bridal Singapore** – wedding dress district, wedding venues, photo albums
- **Dragon Kiln – Pottery Jungle – Bollywood Veggies** - could do short pottery class, activity with motifs on Chinese ceramics – treasure hunt for specific designs and talk on their meanings. Not far from Nanyang Technical Institute
- **Food and Farms** – Behind the scenes at Cold Storage? Jones the grocer, food farm area – see book “Fun in Singapore”
- **Flowers and Thompson Road** – importing, wedding and event, hotel flower design, possible workshop in floral design
- **Botanical Garden** – behind the scenes – education programs, orchid lab, vertical gardens
- **Haw Par Villa** – costume dress for whole group photo, great stories Confucianism, Taoism, Buddhism and views of “hell”
- **Singapore Airlines** – airport tours – need inside connection
- **Nassim Road #2,4, & 6** – 3 beautiful black and white house with different uses – Japan Creative Centre, NGO – Singapore Institute of International Affairs, UNIFEM for Women’s Issues
- **NUS** – Kent Ridge – Cultural Centre – could ask curator to do a tour on a current exhibition or history of the University. ARI (Asia Research Institute) has lots of seminars

- **SMU** – challenges of setting up completely new American style university curriculum
- **Chinatown Sculptor** – Aik Tuan Sculpture Shop, 26 Mohamed Ali Lane Ph 6222 0815, Chinese Brush painting supplies Si Bao Zhai arts gallery, Block 231 Bain Street #02-41/43/45 Bras Basah Complex Ph 6336 0024
- **Semakau Landfill** – bum boat from West Coast Pier, visit education centre, walk around the wetlands Semakau Landfill information leaflet. Available at NEA's Customer Service Centre, Level 2, Environment Building, Scotts Road.
- **Bukit Brown Cemetery** - 36C Lor Halwa, Singapore, Officially opened on 1 January 1922, it operated for more than half a century before its closure in 1973.
- **Conference Hall and Trade Union House** – Open in 1965 and is an fine example of 1960’s urban architecture. It is the home of the Singapore Chinese Orchestra.
- **HortPark** - part of the Southern Ridges that comprises Mount Faber Park, Telok Blangah Hill Park, Kent Ridge Park and Labrador Nature Park, is a one-stop gardening resource centre that brings together gardening-related, recreational, educational, research and retail activities under one big canopy in a park setting.
- **Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve** - covers 130ha of mangroves, mudflats, ponds and secondary forest, home to unique plants and animals, as well as a wintering ground for many migratory birds

- **Kranji Countryside** - The businesses in the area have banded together to promote the area as 'agri-tainment', where you can visit small farms selling organic vegetables, goat milk, ornamental fish, and even frog meat.
- **Buddha Tooth Relic Temple & Museum** – Built in 2007 at a cost of 62 million dollars, it was built to house a tooth that once was believed to have belonged to Buddha.
- **Kusu (meaning turtle) and St. John's islands** A short ferry ride from the Marina South Pier via Island Cruise (SGD 15, roundtrip, inclusive of stops) No food for sale on the islands.
